Idaho Philanthropy Hall of Fame

AJ and Susie Balukoff have spent decades strengthening the institutions that enrich community life throughout the Treasure Valley. Their leadership and generosity have advanced education, healthcare, arts and culture, literacy, and youth development through organizations including the Boise School District, Boise State University Foundation, St. Luke's Health System, Boise Philharmonic, Ballet Idaho, Zoo Boise, and numerous scholarship programs. Their philanthropy reflects a deep commitment to ensuring future generations have access to opportunities that helped shape their own family.

Steve and Cindy Carr have dedicated their lives to service at both the local and global level. Cindy's volunteer leadership with organizations such as the Museum of Idaho, Idaho Falls Symphony, and community schools is matched by Steve's extraordinary humanitarian career with the American Red Cross, where he became the only American elected to the Standing Commission of the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement. Together, they have championed the arts, human rights, humanitarian relief, downtown revitalization, and nonprofit leadership while demonstrating that community begins with simply saying "yes" to opportunities to serve.

The Oppenheimer Family has helped shape Idaho's civic, educational, healthcare, and philanthropic landscape for generations. Beginning with Arthur and Jane Oppenheimer's legacy of community leadership and extending through the transformative work of brothers Skip and Doug Oppenheimer, the family has consistently invested in institutions that improve lives. Their leadership with Idaho Business for Education, St. Luke's Health System, the Idaho Community Foundation, Boise arts organizations, and countless civic initiatives has helped strengthen communities across Idaho while inspiring a culture of giving that continues to influence future generations.

Park and Sharon Price have devoted more than five decades to strengthening Idaho through education, economic development, philanthropy, and the arts. Park helped found the Idaho Community Foundation and became a statewide advocate for educational opportunity through leadership with Idaho Business for Education, the College of Eastern Idaho, and numerous economic development initiatives. Sharon's



leadership in arts and cultural organizations has helped enrich communities throughout Eastern Idaho. Together, they have championed a vision of philanthropy rooted in community participation and the belief that every person can make a difference.

Known for his servant leadership and willingness to step in wherever help is needed, he exemplifies the spirit of volunteerism that Governor Andrus championed throughout his life.
