From Our Leaders

Earlier this year, ICF President and CEO **Steve Burns** visited Bear Lake County, completing his goal to travel to each of Idaho's 44 counties. He calls it one of the greatest journeys of his life. Board Chair **Doug Oppenheimer** asked Steve to share what he learned.

Steve: It's been one of my greatest journeys because I got to spend time in each community visiting with the people who live there, listening to their stories, gaining an understanding of their problems and learning about their dreams for their communities.

Yes, there are plenty of things that could easily divide us, but if we just all spent more time focusing on what unites us—the basic things we all want for our community—then those differences wouldn't matter so much.

Doug: As a supporter of the Idaho Community Foundation, you already know all this. You are among the people who hold your community together and who decide on a daily basis to put community first. We are proud to partner with you and help you reach your dreams for your community.

Our work is not over. In fact, it's really just begun. There is still so much more to do to take care of our communities. Despite the nearly \$12 million in grants we gave in 2023 and the \$177 million we've given in the last 35 years, Idaho communities need more help. We have pledged to involve and unite more Idahoans to grow the Foundation's grantmaking ability to \$20 million per year.

We just need more people to know we are here to help. Please help tell people about the Idaho Community Foundation. Introduce us to those people you know who want to take care of their community. Together we will build the Foundation that Idaho communities need.



On this Idaho journey I've learned three simple things.

First, that every community in Idaho wants the same exact thing. We want nice schools, for our communities to be safe, and to have decent-paying jobs. We want to be able to go to the doctor and have an affordable place to live. For people to be respectful of each other and politely disagree. To take care of those people who are less fortunate and have a few amenities, like a park or a playground and a place to get a good meal. We want places where we can play together and pray together, mourn the sad times and celebrate the good.

Second, there are amazing people in every community who care deeply about their community. I have met hundreds of people who quietly do the right thing every day.

Third, I have learned that community doesn't happen by accident. It is a daily decision. To think about the needs of others and not just yours.

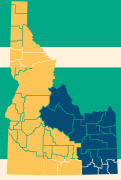

Rehle Higham Legacy Art and Dance Scholarship (Endowed, Designated)

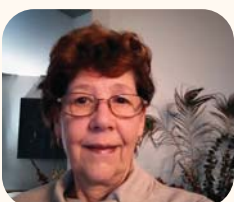

Impacting Lives through Dance

To honor her 50 years of teaching art and dance, former students of **Rehle Higham** established the Rehle Higham Legacy Art and Dance Scholarship at Shelley High School. The scholarship fund is now managed by the Idaho Community Foundation.



Teaching in her backyard studio in Shelley, **Rehle Higham** influenced thousands of southeast Idaho students. Her 8-week ballroom dance and etiquette classes were especially popular. They always concluded with a fancy dinner and dance during which students would perform in front of their parents. She passed away in March 2022.

Rehle's son **Jordan Higham** said many of his mother's former students felt the same way.

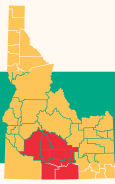

Closing a family foundation: “We knew it was the right time.”



Mary Bradof, age 21

Mary Bradof was “one of those glorious human beings that everyone loved,” recalls her daughter **Ruth Blaha** of Eagle.

“She was one of those giving souls who would invite you into her home and cook you a meal. All of our friends called her mom,” Ruth said.

In 2000, after Ruth and her husband **Bob Blaha** sold their business, they created the Mary Bradof Foundation to honor her mother. They announced it at Mary’s 80th birthday party in 2001.

“Growing up, we weren’t able to do much charitable giving – we just didn’t have much money,” Ruth recalls. “Starting the foundation was a way to start a ‘giving generation’ in the family and reach out to those in our communities who were disadvantaged in some way.”



Mary Bradof, age 85

When Mary passed away in 2020 at the age of 99, it left an enormous hole on the board of directors.

“We all felt that it wasn’t the same without my mother and we were right. Though the foundation’s mission remained we knew we had to make a change,” said Ruth. “We were sad to let it go, but we knew it was the right time.”

Ruth reached out to the Idaho Community Foundation to help close the Mary Bradof Foundation. The foundation’s final disbursement went to the 2023 Forever Idaho Regional Grant Cycle and provided grants to youth sports, arts, music and education in rural communities throughout Idaho.

Glossary of Terms

ICF funds can be endowed or non-endowed:

Endowed: Invested for long-term growth. A portion of the fund balance (currently 4.25%) is available for grants every year.

Non-endowed: Invested for short-term growth. The entire fund balance is available for grants every year.

Description of Funds:

Designated: Fund gives grants to the same community organization(s) every year.

Donor Advised: Fundholder selects community organizations to receive grants and can change them every year.

Field of Interest: Fundholder selects a category of community organizations (ex: arts) and/or a

region of Idaho (ex: north Idaho) to receive grants every year. Forever Idaho Field of Interest Fund grant recommendations are made by ICF’s Regional Councils.

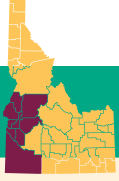
Organization: Established by a community organization (i.e. - Nonprofit) to help it build a solid future.

Scholarship: Fundholder selects criteria for scholarship recipients and may participate in the selection process for recipients.

Thank you for your amazing generosity to nonprofits, schools and community organizations throughout Idaho last year. This past year was an exciting one that culminated in the celebration of our 35th Anniversary in November. Since the Idaho Community Foundation's establishment in 1988, you have made a significant charitable impact in your community. **Collectively, you have given more than \$177 million in grants.** Wow!

Your generosity continued in 2023. At your request, we sent out over 1,800 grants, scholarships and organization distributions totaling more than \$11.7 million last year. In addition to strengthening Idaho communities, you and hundreds of other ICF fundholders, donors and Legacy Society members contributed more than \$12.1 million to ICF charitable giving funds in 2023. Thank you!

Those contributions are growing. Our endowed investment return for 2023 was 16.6%. Our 10-year endowed investment return was 7.0%. Our various non-endowed investment returns were also strong, as you'll see. By the end of 2023, our total assets grew to almost \$251.4 million, which will provide grants to Idaho nonprofits, schools and community organizations in the short-term and long-term.

We are grateful for what you've accomplished individually and proud of what we've accomplished together for Idaho communities. As our state grows and changes, we want to do even more for Idaho. Our goal is to award \$20 million throughout the state by our 40th anniversary in 2028.

We will continue celebrating our 35th Anniversary throughout this year. We hope you will join us when the party comes to your community.

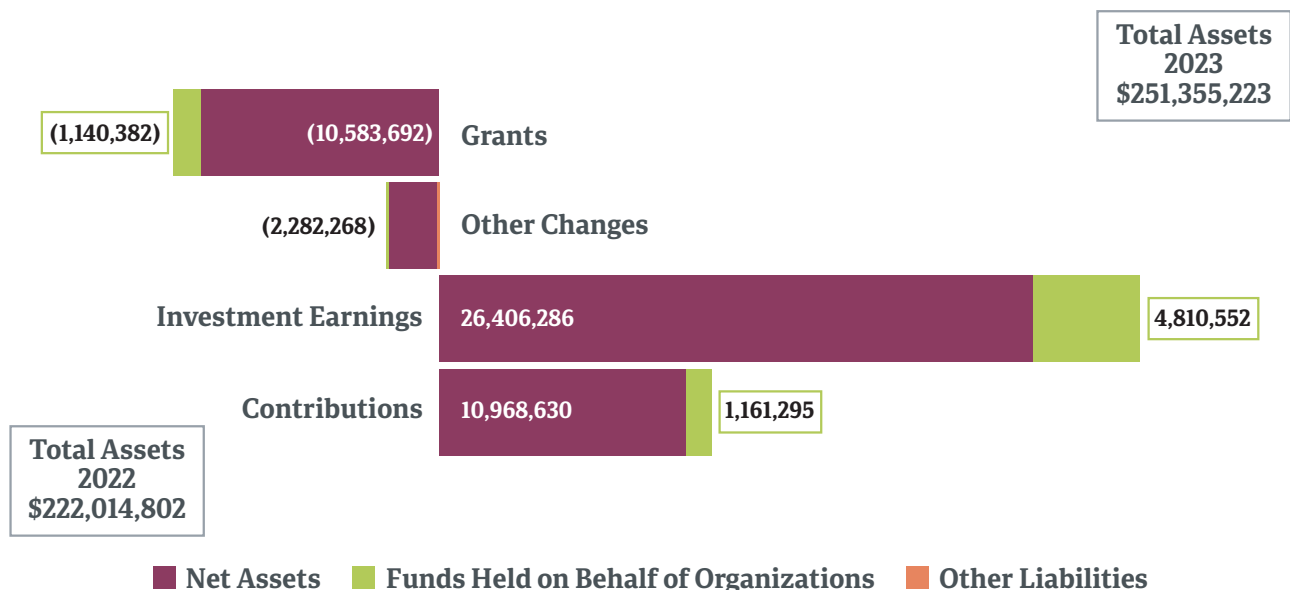

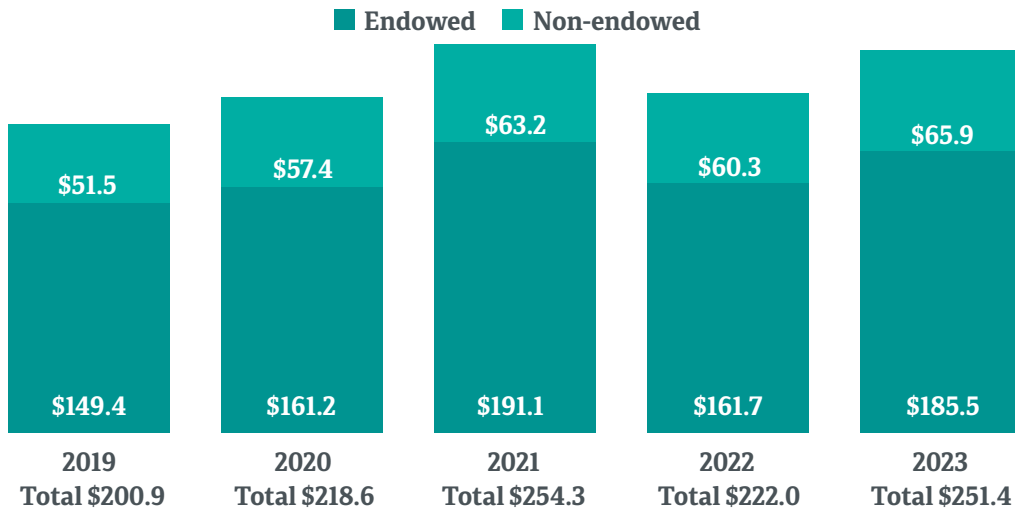

Asset Bridge 2022-2023

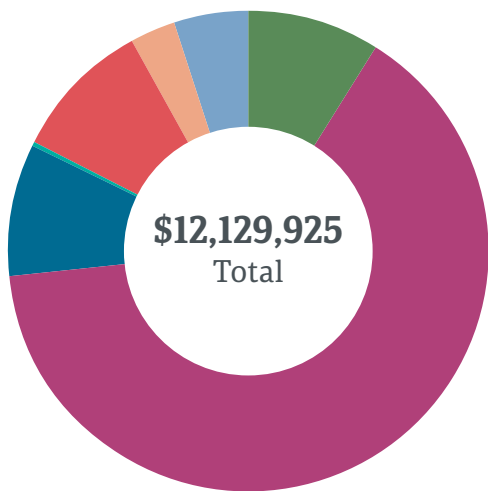

Total Assets (in millions)

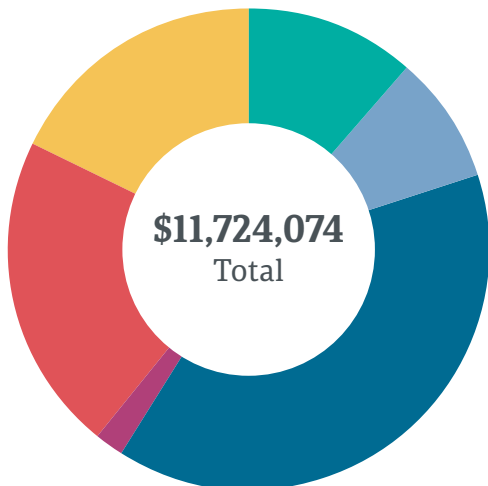


Contributions and Organization Additions by Fund Type



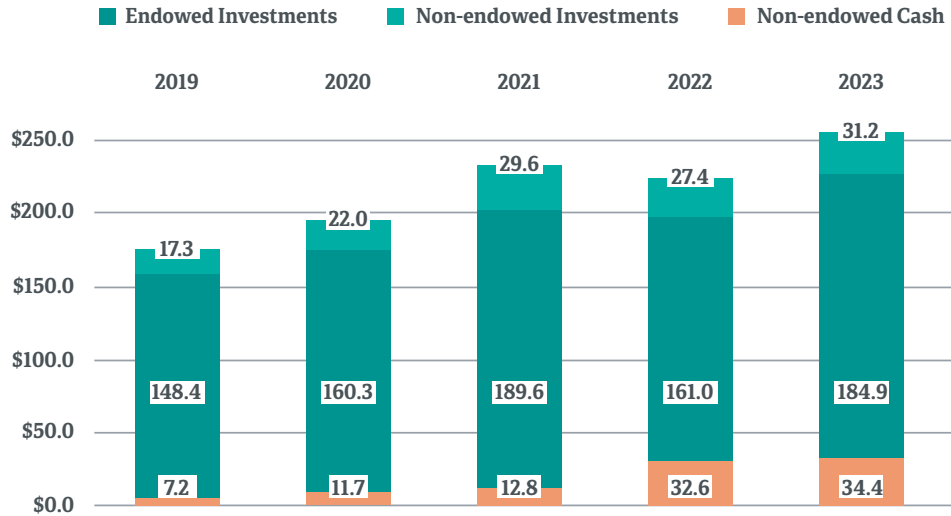

Grants and Organization Distributions by Impact Area



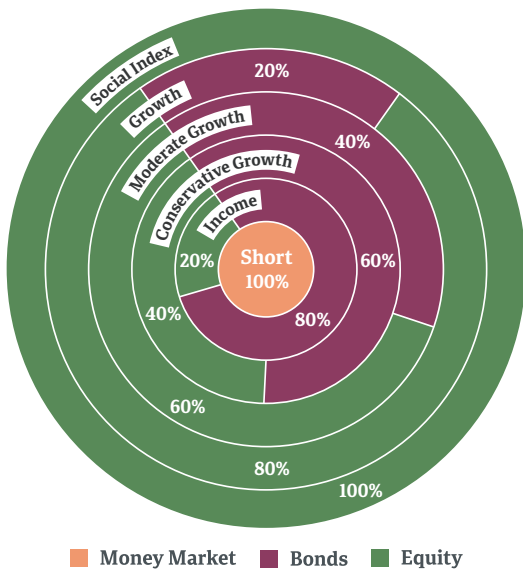

Cash and Investments (dollars in millions)

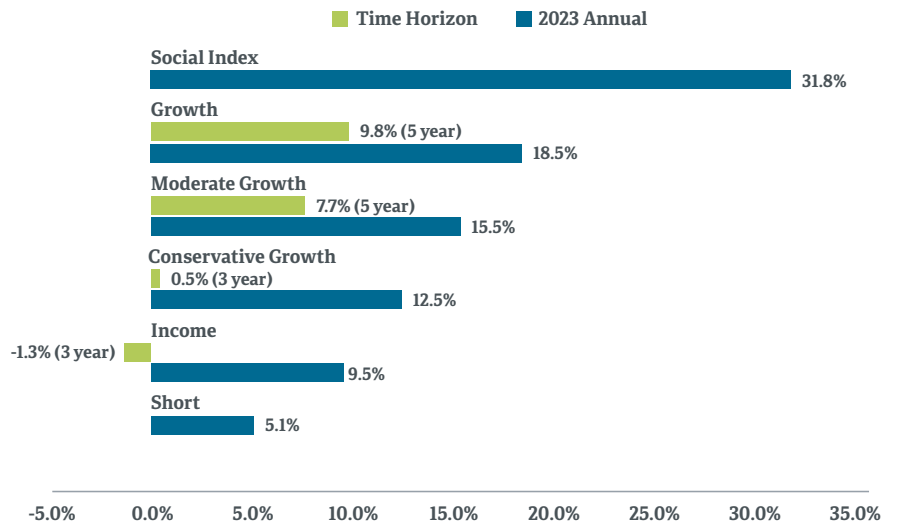


Non-ended Cash and Investments

Target Asset Allocations

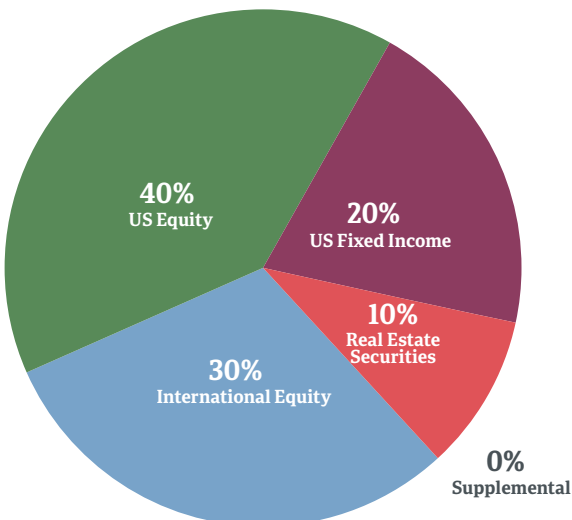

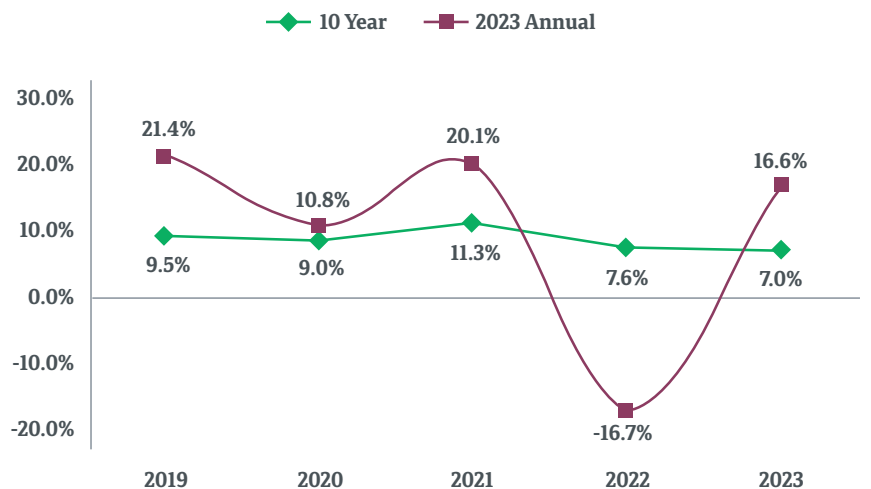

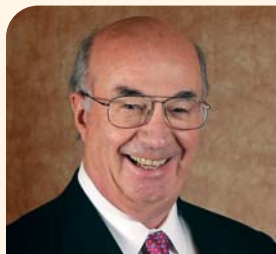
