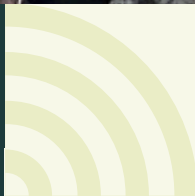

As we reflect on 2025, we do so with deep gratitude for the people, partnerships, and shared commitment that shaped a pivotal year for The Idaho Community Foundation. This year marked an important new chapter as we fully stepped into life as a newly merged organization, united by a clear mission to strengthen communities through philanthropy, elevate nonprofit impact, and connect Idahoans.

Guided by our values: Move Forward Together, Dream Big for Idaho, Seek Joyful Connection, and Serve with Purpose, our work reached communities across the state in meaningful ways. We expanded our statewide presence, welcomed new Community Engagement Associates in East and North Idaho, and surpassed \$200 million in lifetime grantmaking, celebrating that milestone with grants to nonprofits in every region. In 2025 alone, more than \$21.5 million was distributed – years ahead of where we once thought we would be.

Idahoans also came together in powerful ways. Idaho Gives raised a record \$5.15 million, and we launched the Idaho Philanthropy Hall of Fame, honoring those who built, and continue to advance, Idaho’s culture of generosity.

Every fund established and every grant awarded reflects the trust you place in us. As you explore this report, we hope you see not just the impact of a single year, but the momentum of communities moving forward, together.

New Funds in 2025 **Statewide**

Dreaming big also means taking action. Across Idaho, 41 new charitable funds were established in 2025, each one reflecting a commitment to community, opportunity, and lasting impact. In the pages that follow, you'll meet a new fund from each region and see how thoughtful giving is helping build a stronger Idaho.

Idaho Head Start Association Fund [^] – Agency

The Fund was created by the Idaho Head Start Association, Inc. to support Head Start programs through Advocacy, Partnerships, Collaboration, Recognition, and Professional Development to achieve high quality outcomes for Idaho's children, families and communities.

Nonprofit Center Trainings & Workshops Fund ⁺

– Operating – The Fund was established to support Idaho Nonprofit Center Trainings and Workshops, a program within the Idaho Community Foundation

Community Benefit Fund [^] – Special Project

The Fund is designed to facilitate contributions and support community leadership initiatives not related to another established fund within the Community Foundation. It is intended to be used primarily for singular transactions with a short-term identified distribution.

Idaho Gives [^] – Operating

Internal fund established for Idaho Gives. To be used for grant pools or other funds specifically raised for granting out.

2025 Highlight: Standing with North Idaho

In 2025, North Idaho faced an unimaginable tragedy when first responders were killed or wounded in the line of duty. In the immediate aftermath, ICF partnered with our affiliate, the Greater Coeur d'Alene Community Foundation, to respond with care, urgency, and purpose.

Together, the Foundations quickly established a special fund to ensure that community generosity could be directed where it was needed most. Contributions were designated to support the Red & Blue Foundation, a trusted nonprofit with a long history of serving Kootenai County's first responders and their families, providing emergency assistance, financial support, and compassionate care in moments of crisis.

This response reflected the strength of community-led philanthropy: local partners mobilizing quickly, donors stepping forward, and resources flowing through trusted organizations to support healing, resilience, and recovery when it mattered most.

New Funds in 2025 **North Idaho**

We welcomed several news funds originating from North Idaho this year!

Bradley Scholarship Fund⁺ – *Scholarship*

It is the intent of the Donors to provide (2) two year or four (4) year scholarships (depending on the institution) to deserving students who graduate from a Kootenai County Public High School, and who are aging out of the Idaho Foster Care Program.

Canopy Village Fund[^] – *Agency*

The Fund was created to provide support to build compassionate communities where every child feels safe, secure, and is nurtured in a stable and loving family.

Chestnut Scholarship Fund in Honor of Jordan Johnson⁺ – *Designated*

The Fund was created to honor youth that give to the community and better themselves through a scholarship that will be administered through the Boys & Girls Club of Kootenai County with preference given to students going into the medical field.

Fosberg Staniewski Family Fund – *Advised*

The Fund was created in memory of Maynard A. Fosberg and Margaret Fosberg to support Northern Idaho nonprofit organizations in perpetuity.

Greater Coeur d'Alene Community Foundation Administrative Fund[^] – *Field of Interest*

The Greater Coeur d'Alene Community Foundation will contribute to the quality of life throughout the greater Coeur d'Alene area by enhancing and fostering charitable giving and philanthropy.

Greater Coeur d'Alene Community Foundation Project Fund[^] – *Special Project*

The Greater Coeur d'Alene Community Foundation will contribute to the quality of life throughout the greater Coeur d'Alene area by enhancing and fostering charitable giving and philanthropy.

Idaho Children At-Risk Fund[^] – *Field of Interest*

The Fund was created to provide case work and social work in Idaho public schools and community spaces to address concerns related to children at risk in Idaho, including prevention and treatment of mental health and behavioral health challenges, and adverse childhood experiences. Distributions from the Fund will be provided to existing or newly created nonprofits working to address the needs of At-Risk Children.

McNaughton/Sanderson Fund[^] – *Advised*

The Fund was created by Mary Sanderson to support the needs of the Coeur d'Alene area.

North Idaho Action Fund – Forever Idaho⁺

– *Field of Interest* – The Fund was created by an anonymous Idaho family to support organizations serving residents in Bonner or Boundary counties and focused on mental health initiatives and/or expanding educational, artistic or recreational opportunities for youth.

North Idaho Action Fund – Project ECHO⁺

– *Designated* – The Fund was created by an anonymous Idaho family to support Project ECHO through the University of Idaho Foundation.

Stephen J. Nemecek Memorial Scholarship⁺

– *Scholarship* – The Fund was created in memory of Stephen J. Nemecek to provide financial assistance to students seeking higher education who can think for themselves, are caring, honest, and want to help others in need.

Bingham County Historical Society Fund⁺
– *Agency* – Distributions from the fund will be used to support the operational needs of the Bingham County Historical Society.

Bruce & Stephanie Fehringer STEM Scholarship⁺
– *Designated* – Annual distributions from the Fund will be granted to American Falls High School to award scholarships to students pursuing degrees or certificates in STEM-related fields.

Park and Sharon Price Family Fund[^] – *Advised*
The Fund is used to support charitable organizations that are meaningful to Park and Sharon Price and their family, and to encourage ongoing family philanthropy and support of Idaho. It is the hope of the Park and Sharon that their posterity will continue to support Idaho through the Idaho Community Foundation and establish their own charitable funds.

2025 Highlight: The \$200M Moment

In 2025, ICF reached a milestone years in the making, surpassing \$200 million in lifetime grantmaking. This moment marked more than a financial achievement; it reflected decades of generosity, partnership, and trust from Idahoans committed to strengthening their communities. To honor the moment, we celebrated by doing what we do best: giving back. \$10,000 grants were awarded to four nonprofit organizations – one in each region of the state.

In East Idaho, that grant went to Community Suicide Prevention, an all-volunteer-led nonprofit serving 16 counties across Eastern and Southeastern Idaho. For the organization, the grant meant more than financial support, it strengthened their ability to raise awareness, provide education, and show up for communities navigating some of life’s hardest moments.

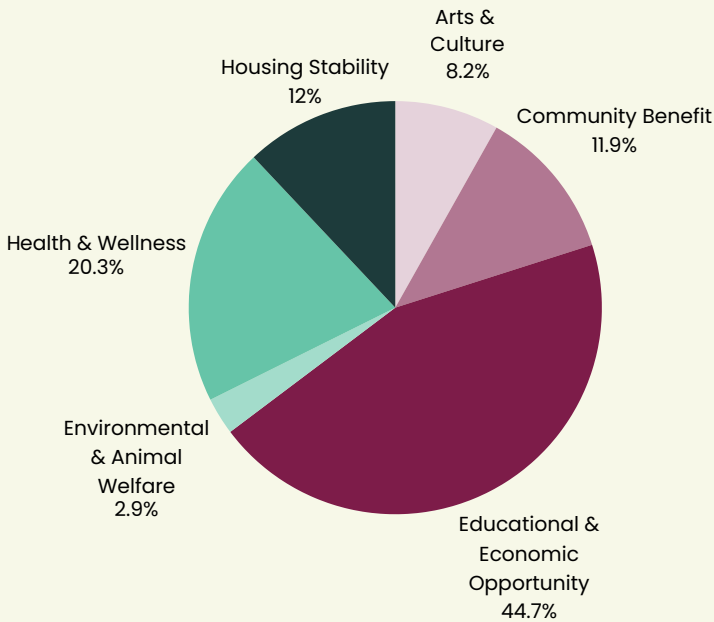
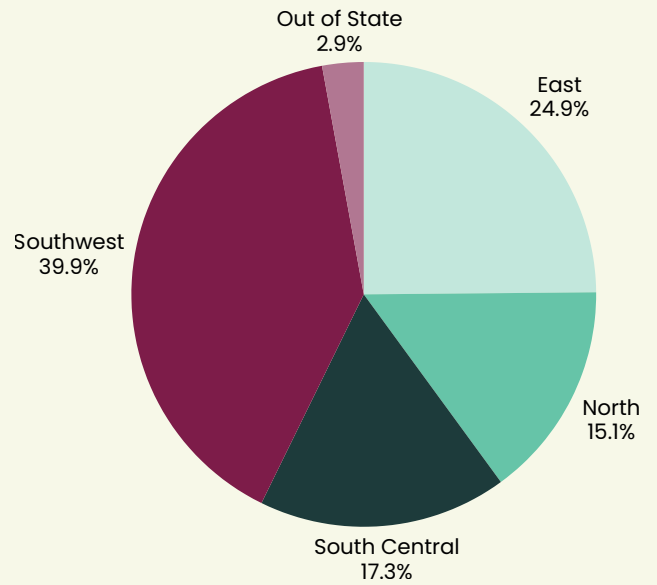

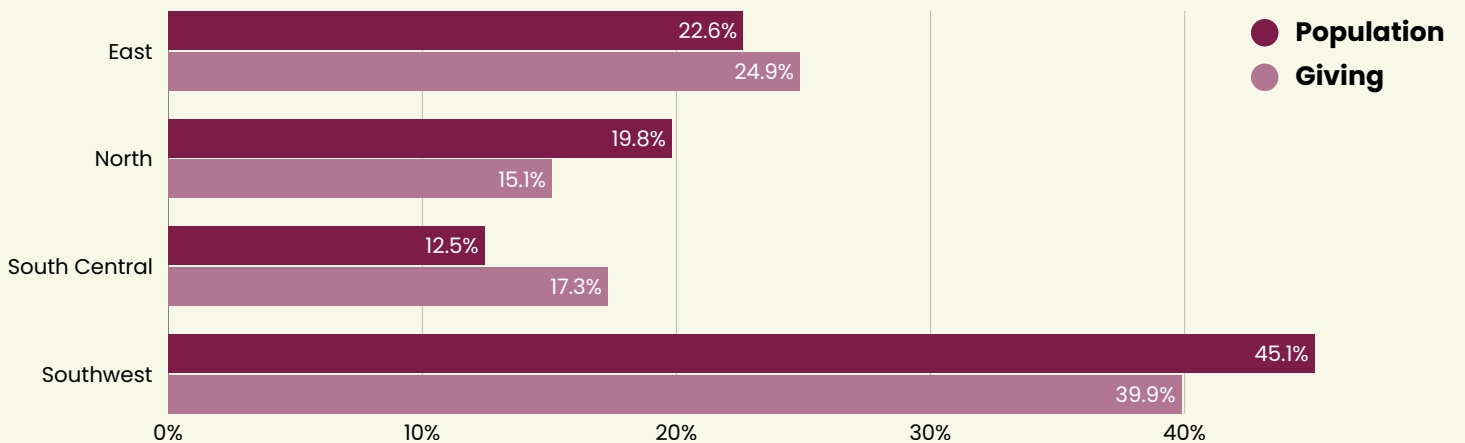

2025 Highlight: Neighbors Make Minidoka County

In 2025, ICF proudly welcomed its newest affiliate, the Minidoka County Foundation, a volunteer-led, hometown foundation rooted in the belief that Minidoka County takes care of its own. When the foundation announced its goal to raise \$25,000 by January 31, 2026, even some ICF staffers wondered if the timeline was ambitious.

The community had something to prove. By the January 31 deadline, neighbors in Rupert and communities across Minidoka County didn’t just meet the goal – they more than doubled it, raising over \$50,000 to launch the Foundation’s permanent endowment.

That generosity will live on. Beginning in 2027, the Minidoka County Foundation will make community-directed grants, ensuring local dollars continue strengthening local causes for generations to come. It’s a powerful reminder of what’s possible when a community comes together.

New Funds in 2025 Southwest

Ben J. Plastino Memorial Scholarship⁺

– *Designated* – The Fund was created by Diane Plastino Graves and Ronald N. Graves to honor her father, Ben J. Plastino, a long-time Idaho journalist and Executive Editor of the Idaho Falls Post Register, by providing scholarship support to high achieving upperclassmen students with journalism majors in the department of Journalism and Mass Media (JAMM) in the College of Letters, Arts and Social Sciences at the University of Idaho.

C.O.M.B.S. Enterprise[^] – *Advised*

The sponsors of this fund have been blessed based on hard work ethics with the opportunity to give back. The primary purpose of this fund is to support education, health, and to develop lifelong learning and skills.

2025 Highlight: A Safety Net

The Nonprofit Impact Fund was established in 2025 as a bold investment in the people who power Idaho’s nonprofit sector. The fund supports capacity building, professional development, and training, ensuring nonprofit leaders have the tools they need to sustain their work and serve communities well.

That commitment resonated deeply at ICF’s first-ever fundraiser for the fund, held during the Gem Ball and Idaho Philanthropy Hall of Fame celebration. Through a paddle raise, donors contributed more than \$200,000, sending a clear message: a strong Idaho depends on strong nonprofit organizations—and the people behind them.

Among those in the audience was Laurie Fascilla, Executive Director of Giraffe Laugh, who later shared how meaningful it felt to be “seen” and valued as a nonprofit leader. Her words captured what the Nonprofit Impact Fund represents – a community choosing to care for those who care for others.

Celebration of Philanthropy: Idaho Falls

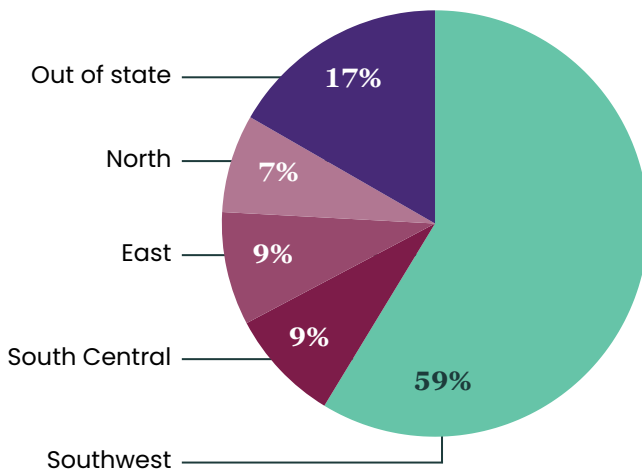

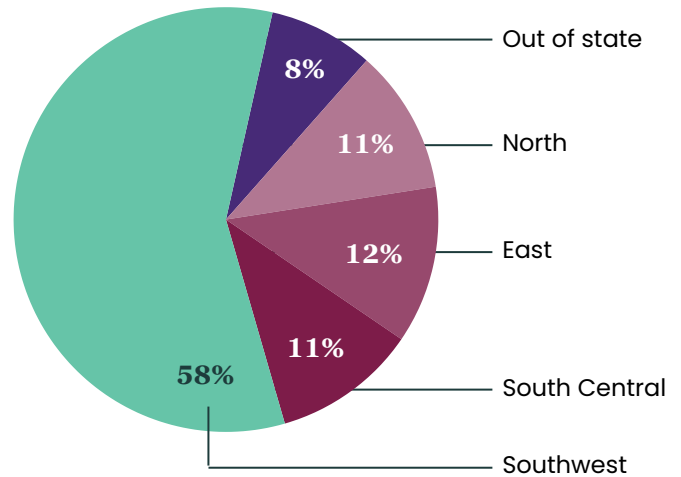

Financial Stewardship

Dear Partners,

In 2025, ICF's endowed assets returned 15.6%, reflecting a strong year across global financial markets. This growth helped strengthen the Foundation's ability to support Idaho communities now and into the future.

For nearly 40 years, our highly experienced Investment Subcommittee has successfully guided the Foundation's investments, helping fuel more than \$220 million in grants to nonprofits across Idaho. Our disciplined approach prioritizes long-term stability, responsible risk management, and sustainable support for charitable giving.

This approach helped ICF maintain a diversified portfolio designed to weather market cycles and provide consistent support for Idaho's nonprofits and communities over time.

2025 At-A-Glance

ICF experienced a strong investment year in 2025:

- **Endowed portfolio return*:** +15.6% (net of fees)
- **10-year annualized return*:** 9.2% — demonstrating long-term strength and stability.
- **Support made possible:** Performance helped fuel \$16.1 million in grants, scholarships, and distributions benefiting Idaho communities and students.

Our Investment Philosophy

We steward charitable assets for the long term, emphasizing steady growth, responsible risk management, and consistency. Our Investment Committee, supported by independent consultant Cerity Partners (fka Verus), maintains close alignment with ICF's Investment Policy to ensure donor gifts grow over time and continue meeting community needs far into the future.

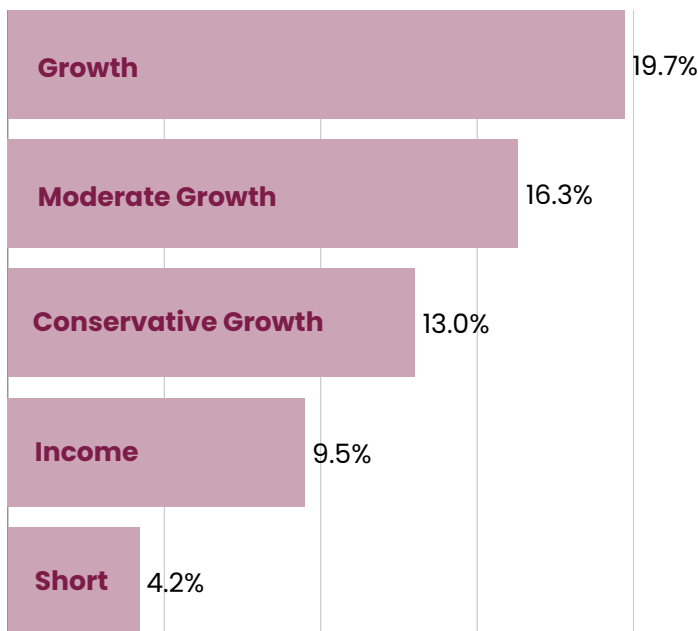
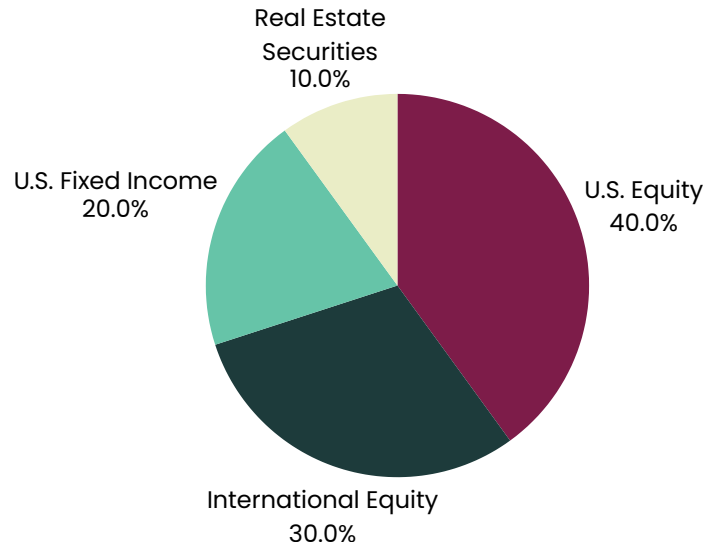
This disciplined strategy allows us to serve with purpose and deliver meaningful impact statewide.

Built for Steady Growth

ICF’s endowment is structured for reliable, durable growth through disciplined asset allocation and risk management. We compare favorably over the long term: our **9.2% 10-year average** net return outpaces the 7.7% net return reported by the FY25 Commonfund Study of Endowments, which benchmarks university and foundation endowments nationwide. This demonstrates how our steady approach supports expanded, sustainable grantmaking for Idaho communities.

Non-endowed Funds

Non-endowed funds offer flexible investment options designed to match a donor’s time horizon and risk preference. These funds may be invested for intermediate-term to short term use, with allocations ranging from conservative, income-focused approaches to growth-oriented strategies. The chart to the left reflects 2025 investment performance. Returns fluctuate with market performance, allowing donors to align the investment approach with the timing and purpose of their giving.
