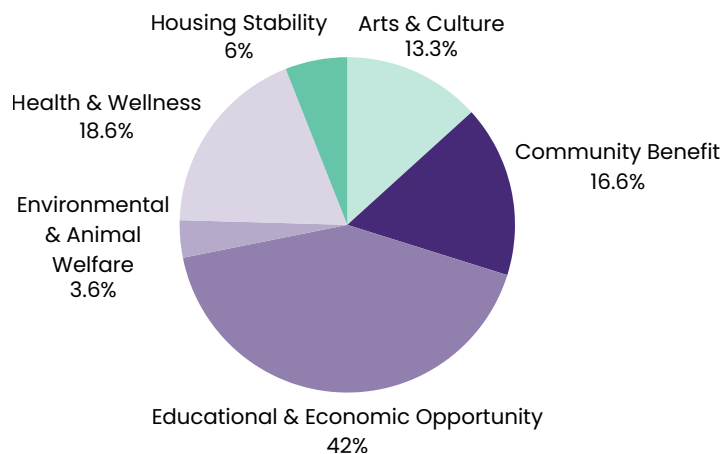

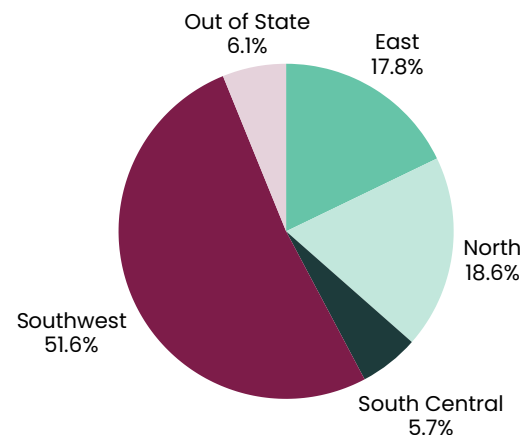
Total Grants by Impact Area

Fund Highlight: Investing in McCall's Future



For more than 75 years, the Rotary Club of McCall has lived the Rotary motto of **Service Above Self**. Chartered in 1949, the club is the largest and most active Rotary club in Valley County, with 50 members dedicated to making their community stronger.

The club's impact can be seen throughout the McCall area. Rotary members support scholarships for local high school seniors and provide grants to organizations including the McCall Curling Club, Cascade Public Library, McCall Outdoor Science School, Payette Lakes Ski Club, Pilgrim Cove Camp, and many others.

To help sustain these efforts for years to come, the Rotary Club of McCall Foundation recently established both endowed and non-endowed funds at the Idaho Community Foundation. Together, the funds provide flexible support for current charitable activities while creating a permanent source of funding for future community needs.

New Funds

Dreaming big also means taking action. Between Jan. 1 and June 30, 2026, 11 new charitable funds were established – each reflecting a commitment to community, opportunity, and lasting impact.

America250 in Idaho Commemoration Fund[^] – Special Project

The Fund provides an opportunity for the general public to participate in the America250 in Idaho Commemoration, to celebrate the 250th anniversary of the United States, through contributions to specified projects approved by the America250 in Idaho Advisory Committee.

Campbell Kowalczyk Memorial Fund[^] – Advised
Established in honor of Campbell Kowalczyk, to support causes and organizations important to Campbell and his family.

Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Center Endowed Fund⁺ – Agency

DVSAC's mission is to provide compassionate support, resources, and advocacy for victims of violent crime. This Fund was created to support the mission of the Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Center (DVSAC) forever.

Fernan Lake Water Quality Improvement Fund[^] – Special Project

The Fund was created to support the long-term water quality improvement of Fernan Lake. Contributions will be used to pay for projects associated with the mitigation and remediation of phosphorous through the use of Department of Environmental Quality and/or Environmental Protection Agency approved methods.

Hans Buhler IRA Fund⁺ – Designated

The Fund was created to provide ongoing operational support for the Stanley Christian Fellowship in Stanley, Idaho, to provide Christ based worship, fellowship, support, and outreach for the people of Stanley and surrounding communities.

Lakeland Education Foundation Endowed Fund⁺ – Field of Interest

This fund was created to support Education within Lakeland Joint School District 272 with a main focus on supporting the Lakeland Education Foundation's scholarships and teacher grants within the Lakeland Joint School District 272 in perpetuity.

Lakeland Education Foundation Scholarship Fund[^] – Scholarship

To support education in the Lakeland Joint School District 272 by providing scholarships to students graduating from the Lakeland Joint School District 272.

Lakeland Education Foundation Scholarship of Hope Fund[^] – Scholarship

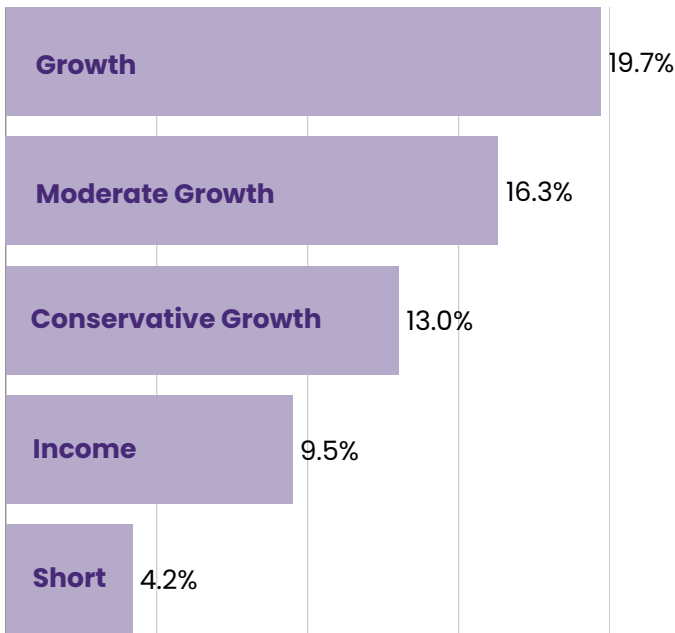
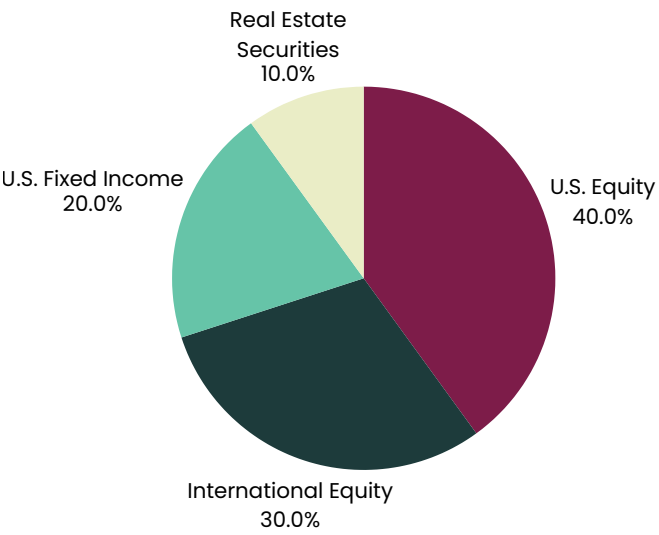

Built for Steady Growth

ICF’s endowment is structured for reliable, durable growth through disciplined asset allocation and risk management. We compare favorably over the long term: our **9.2% 10-year average** net return outpaces the 7.7% net return reported by the FY25 Commonfund Study of Endowments, which benchmarks university and foundation endowments nationwide. This demonstrates how our steady approach supports expanded, sustainable grantmaking for Idaho communities.

Non-endowed Funds

Non-endowed funds offer flexible investment options designed to match a donor’s time horizon and risk preference. These funds may be invested for intermediate-term to short term use, with allocations ranging from conservative, income-focused approaches to growth-oriented strategies.

The chart to the left reflects 2025 investment performance. Returns fluctuate with market performance, allowing donors to align the investment approach with the timing and purpose of their giving.
