Frequently Asked Questions

Why is a memorial being created?

The memorial will give Twin Falls a lasting place to remember those we lost, honor everyone whose life was changed, and spend time in quiet reflection.

Who is deciding what the memorial will look like?

The City of Twin Falls is leading the memorial planning process with input from the community.

Design details, community involvement opportunities, and final decisions will be shared as they become available.

Once the planning committee information is finalized, we will update this space.

What will donated funds support?

Donations will be used only for approved memorial expenses. These may include community input, planning, design, permits, construction, installation, accessibility, security, communications, and long-term care. The City of Twin Falls and the Twin Falls Community Foundation will oversee project decisions and spending and will explain how funds will be handled if plans change.

Where will the memorial be located?

The location has not yet been selected. Families, survivors, first responders, accessibility and trauma-informed advisors, property owners, and community members will help guide the decision. The City will consider privacy, accessibility, parking, seating, shade, restrooms, lighting, safety, long-term care, and whether the site feels appropriate for reflection.

Updates will be shared as decisions are made.

Who will ultimately manage and be responsible for the funds raised?

A committee that includes representatives from the City of Twin Falls, the Twin Falls Community Foundation and community members will lead decisions about how funds are used for the memorial project. The City will not collect or manage donations. The Twin Falls Community Foundation will lead fundraising, and the Idaho Community Foundation will provide financial management and stewardship of the charitable fund. Contributions will be used only for approved memorial-related purposes.



Will funds go directly to victims or families?

No. This campaign is separate from funds that provide direct assistance to victims, survivors, or families. Gifts to this fund will be used only for approved memorial-related purposes.

Who manages donated funds?

Contributions will be managed through the Twin Falls Community Foundation's Special Projects Fund with administrative support from the Idaho Community Foundation.

Is my donation tax deductible?

Yes. The Twin Falls Community Foundation Special Projects Fund is administered through the Idaho Community Foundation, recognized by the IRS as a tax-exempt 501(c)(3) public charity under sections 501(c)(3), 509(a)(1), and 170(b)(1)(A)(vi) of the Internal Revenue Code. EIN 82-0425063.

What is the fundraising goal and what happens if more money is raised than is needed for the memorial, or if plans change?

The memorial project is still in the early stages of planning, and fundraising needs will continue to be evaluated as the vision takes shape. The City of Twin Falls and the Twin Falls Community Foundation will provide updates throughout the process, including information about project costs and fund use. Any decisions regarding remaining funds or changes to project plans would be made transparently and in accordance with the fund's charitable purpose and applicable nonprofit stewardship requirements.

How will I receive updates?

Project updates, fundraising milestones, and memorial planning information will be shared through campaign communications and community updates.
